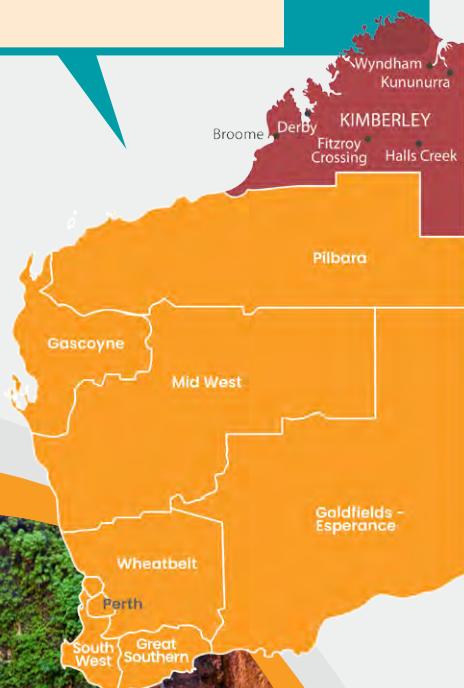
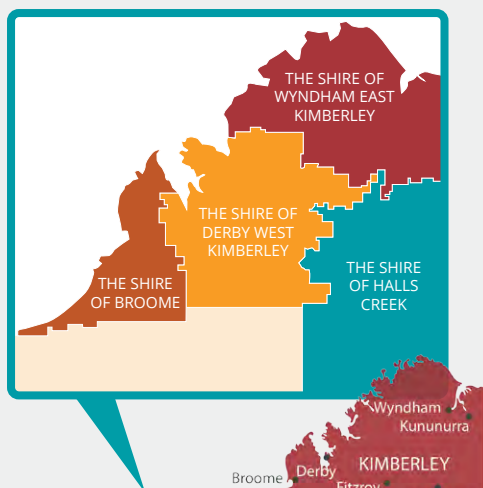


OUR GROUP

OUR ADVOCACY:

1 – POLICY SETTINGS AND INVESTMENT

The Kimberley Regional Group is advocating for policy settings and seeking sustained and increased investment into the entire region in order that it may deliver growth and prosperity.

Policy Settings:

- Sustainable funding for local government
- Tax reform to support regional business and regional workforce growth
- First Port of Call Entry status and accompanying infrastructure and services
- Land tenure reform
- Appropriate alcohol management strategies

Sustained and increased investment in the following areas:

2 – INVESTMENT INTO PLACE-BASED PROJECTS

The Kimberley Regional Group is seeking investment in a diversified program of place-based projects that deliver local, regional and national benefits.



Tanami Road Activation Plan – \$70M

Investment to optimise the sealing of the Tanami Road, a new east-west freight and tourist route from Alice Springs into Halls Creek. Investment will capitalise on the opening up the region, supporting growth in natural resources, pastoralism, tourism, Aboriginal economic development and industrial projects.



Fitzroy Crossing Airport and Access Road – \$30M

Investment for a fit for purpose airport runway and all weather safe road between the airport, Fitzroy Crossing and Fitzroy Crossing Hospital.



East Kimberley Regional Airport Kununurra, New Arrivals Terminal – \$20M

Investment to build airport capacity to drive growth.



Broome Boating Facility – \$42M

Investment into a new facility for boat launching, retrieval and passenger transfer between vessels and shore.



Derby Wharf Precinct Masterplan and Redevelopment – \$2M

Investment into the strategically located Derby Port to facilitate development of significant onshore and offshore hydrocarbon reserves for export into Asia.



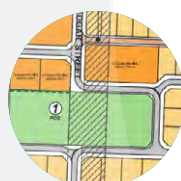
Wyndham Boat Launching Facility – \$10.5M

Investment into a new boat launch facility to replace aging structure.



Social And Affordable Housing Project, Halls Creek Stage 1 – \$20M

Investment to deliver 19 new dwellings, across five infill sites within Halls Creek and surrounding town based communities.



Service Workers Accommodation, Derby And Fitzroy Crossing – \$25M

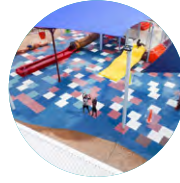
Investment into affordable housing to attract and retain critical service workers in sectors such as community health, not-for-profit social service organisations, tourism, childcare, retail and hospitality.

2 – INVESTMENT INTO PLACE-BASED PROJECTS CONTINUED.



Halls Creek Cultural Centre And Multi-Purpose Evacuation Facility – \$40M

Investment into a new Visitor and Tourism Centre, with areas for commercial opportunities.



Wyndham Playground And Splash Park – \$3M

Investment into a vibrant recreational space for families and children.



Fitzroy Crossing Multipurpose Complex And Evacuation Centre – \$32.25M

Investment to enable the community to come together, recreate in a safe environment and build social inclusion and resilience.



Zero Depth Water Splash Pad, Halls Creek – \$3M

Investment into a vibrant recreational space for families and children.



Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre – \$21.4M

Investment into the Kimberley's regional venue for sporting events and carnivals.



Fitzroy Eastern Flood And Fire Resilience Hub – \$35M

Investment into a Central Hub for the co-location of services in the event of future flooding/ fire leading to isolation in the Fitzroy Valley.



Welcome To WA Centre, Kununurra – \$30M

Investment into a new facility to host the Kununurra Visitors Centre, Aboriginal Cultural Centre and Art Gallery, a Heritage Museum, café, retail and commercial spaces, and a multi-purpose event/ entertainment space.



Walmanyjun Cable Beach Foreshore Redevelopment – \$9.3M

Investment into Stage 2 and 3 of the development to expand Broome's peak tourism season by stimulating commercial and tourism activation.



Regional Resource Recovery Park, Broome – \$21.8M

Investment in the relocation of Broome's ageing waste management facility.
